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EXCEPTION CHECKLIST FOR BIA CATEGORICAL EXCLUSIONS

Project: Tribal Main Administrative Campus Site Development, P1009000
Port Gamble Indian Reservation

Nature of Proposed Action:

Redevelopment of existing parking areas and internal circulation roadways within and around the following Tribal services: Natural Resources, Maintenance, Administration / Tribal Center, and Head Start. The project is a continuation of a recent federal project (House of Knowledge) funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Rural Development. Redevelopment activities will also include pedestrian facilities with provisions for the elderly and / or handicapped.

Mitigation measures as set forth in previous environmental analysis (USDA) recommends stormwater treatment (Attachment E). As such, current informal parking and drainage will be formalized with full water quality treatment following recommendations by the WA State Department of Ecology, Western Washington Stormwater Manual (2005). Specific water quality BMPs include: biofiltration swales, pre-settling / infiltration bays, and grass filter strips. Underground pipe conveyance will be minimized to shallow driveway culverts. Conveyance elements are designed to accommodate the 10 year - 24 hour storm event.

Appendix 4 Exclusion Category:

516 DM 10.4 L(2) Construction of bicycle and pedestrian lanes and paths adjacent to existing highways and within the existing rights-of-way.

516 DM 10.4 L(8) Resurfacing a highway without adding to the existing width.
