Interested individuals or firms must have either completed HAZWOPER instructional programs and are up-to-date in their refresher trainings, or have the academic credentials and instructional experience required to teach HAZWOPER courses as per 29 CFR 1910.120.

The purpose of this training series is to provide educational opportunities that enhance employment value and safety knowledge to the PGST community.

The contractor will perform HAZWOPER trainings per the following annual schedule:

We anticipate there to be up to 15 participants in each course.

If needed, hotel accommodations and meal stipends may be provided to training staff for multi-day training sessions.
